Option 1	North Eastern Boundary	Cut back the overhang from the neighbouring trees overhanging the north-eastern boundary, to nearer the boundary Remove cut material from site Please see note 1	£325.00
Option 2	South West Boundary	Trim the side of the trees/shrubs overhanging across the boundary Remove cut material from site Please see note 1	£81.25
Option 3	Sycamore Tree	Cut down the sycamore tree to just above the fence height Remove cut material from site We could treat the stump to stop it regrowing if you'd prefer this, if not it will likely regenerate again in the way a pollard would Please see note 2	£97.50

Notes	-	<p>Note 1 - Whilst you have a legal right to cut anything that overhangs your boundary, the cut material must be offered to the tree owners. We usually write a letter stating the intention to cut the trees and offering them the cut material with a caveat that we will remove it from site if we hear otherwise. I have never known anyone to take the cut material in all of my years as a tree surgeon.</p> <p>Note 2 - The tree is pretty much on the centre of the fence so could belong to the owners of either side or could be shared ownership (originally planted on the boundary). It is worth also bearing in mind that fences are often put where it is easiest (avoiding trees) or even attached to a tree so the fence can't be used as a definitive as to where the exact boundary line is. A discussion with the neighbouring land owner must take place before any work can be undertaken on this tree unless there is proof that the tree is within the allotment boundary.</p>
